Table 3: Noblit and Hare's seven stage meta-ethnographic process:³⁶

1) identifying a research area of interest
2) deciding what is relevant to the initial interest
3) reading the studies
4) determining how the studies are related
5) translating the studies into one another
6) synthesising the translations
7) expressing the synthesis
