Adnan (Elie Haddad) and Bana (Toyah Frantzen) have left war-torn Syria in order to reach the UK. Traveling through Europe with money running low, they are forced into the notorious Calais Jungle.

Faced with the prospect of a risky illegal entry to the UK or the squalor of the camp they decide to take their chances on the trucks and ferry in a desperate bid to make it to the UK.

The screening will be followed by a Q&A with Director Jason Wingard, Camera Operator Andrew Butler and cast members Elie Haddad, Toyah Frantzen, Biniyam Biruk Theshome and Yousef Jubeh.
