Appendix Three: Layer One of Analysis - Stages of Analysis

(Adapted from Colaizzi, 1978 and Creswell, 2007)

1	Personal experiences: Researcher acknowledges their own positionality.
2	Reading and Noting: To become familiar with the data.
3	List of significant statements: At this point notes are made about why statements were
	marked as significant.
4	Group statements into units of meaning: using individual experiences.
5	Clustering relevant statements into overall units of meaning: using group experiences.
6	A concluding composite description: The 'essence' of friendship. Drawing together
	individual views into one common description.
