

The markings should:

- focus queues along the building frontage as long as this is safe
- be parallel to the frontage
- be on one side of the footway to allow people to pass in a safe way
- Queues should not extend beyond the frontage of individual shops.
- Use temporary degradable paint and renew it when necessary
- Permanent paint is not permitted.

Hampshire County Council (2020)

The unwritten rules of queuing:

- you may not push in
- you may leave the queue momentarily and return to your original place
- a close family member may join you
- in long, immobile queues, you can leave a place-holder & come back later.


"QUEUETOPIA"

March was the busiest month on record for supermarkets across Britain as shoppers stocked up on vital supplies to prepare for the coronavirus pandemic.

Grocery sales rose by a staggering 20.6% in the last four weeks, and 7.6% in the last 12, according to new data from Kantar, beating even the Christmas shopping surge.

It comes as the boss of online grocer Ocado warned shoppers are currently buying £1billion more food a week than usual - with suppliers doubling their production to replicate the weeks before Christmas.


