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An interdisciplinary global editorial team, convened by Lab4Living's Dr Joe Langley, has launched a call for papers for a special issue of journal **Evidence & Policy**. The editors seek expressions of interest on papers exploring Creativity, Co-production and healthy societies in the context of evidence and policy. Evidence & Policy is an international peer reviewed journal of research, debate and practice.

Evidence & Policy: Special issue topic: Creativity, Co-production (and healthy societies...)

A previous issue of **Evidence & Policy** has identified a need for focussing on how creativity can be applied to 'evidence into practice' debates, and how understanding the roots of and differences between co-creation and coproduction will help us to identify their potential contribution to evidenceinformed policy and practice.
